## **PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE**

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 119.03, notice is hereby given that the Department of Administrative Services intends to conduct a public hearing for the purpose of amending Ohio Administrative Code Sections 123:1-9-01, 123:1-9-02, 123:1-11-04, 123:1-11-05, 123:1-11-08, 123:1-15-01 and the rescission of Ohio Administrative Code Section 123:1-15-03.

The proposed to be amended rules deal with the following subject matter:

- 123:1-9-01 Examination Guidelines Practices and procedures associated with how civil service examinations are administered.
- 123:1-9-02 Subjects and Weights Determination of the subject matter of civil service examinations and the criteria used to determine the passing score of a civil service examination.
- 123:1-11-04 Character and Fitness of Applicant Exclusion of an applicant from a civil service examination or the removal of an applicant's name from an eligibility list.
- 123:1-11-05 False Statements Procedures associated with false statements by an applicant in an application for a civil service examination.
- 123:1-11-08 Applications Information that can be used to determine if an applicant is qualified for a civil service examination and associated procedures.
- 123:1-15-01 Eligibility Lists Procedures and protocols for the administration of eligibility lists.

The proposed to be rescinded rule deals with the following subject matter:

123:1-15-03 Joint Employment and Certification – Procedures and protocols for the administration of positions where the work situation requires joint employment of individuals related by heredity or marriage.

The Department of Administrative Services shall hold a public hearing on the proposed rule amendment on Tuesday, August 2, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in Room 2793, on the 27th floor of the James A. Rhodes State Office Tower located at 30 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio. At this hearing, any person affected by the rules may appear and be heard in person, by the person's attorney, or both, may present the person's position, arguments, or contentions orally or in writing, offer and examine witnesses, and present evidence that tends to show that the rules, if adopted or effectuated, will be unreasonable or unlawful.
