The Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife will conduct a public administrative hearing on April 23, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. at the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife, 2045 Morse Road Columbus, OH 43229-6693. For the reasons set forth below, the hearing will be closed to in-person attendance from the public. A link will be provided on the Division of Wildlife's website that will allow the public to live-stream the hearing and provide comments on the rule package.

The purpose of this hearing is to consider the adoption, amendment and rescission of Administrative Code rules concerning the harvest, possession, management and protection of ginseng and the taking, possession, management and protection of wild and captive held animals that are the responsibility of the Division of Wildlife.

The proposed rules include but are not limited to the establishment of open and closed seasons, sportfishing, methods of taking, bag and possession limits, management of endangered species, administration of division owned, administered, and leased lands, special permits, sport fishing regulations, ginseng regulations, reptile and amphibian licensing and permit regulations. Wild animals include mollusks, crustaceans, aquatic insects, fish, reptiles, and amphibians, wild birds, wild quadrupeds, and all other wild mammals.
