

**PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

Pursuant to section 3125.25 and Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, the director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services gives notice of the department's intent to consider the amendment of the rules as identified below and of a public hearing thereon.

The following Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules been reviewed in accordance with section 119.032 of the Revised Code, which requires the review of all state agency rules within a five-year period:

- Rule 5101:12-60-50 describes how the child support enforcement agency (CSEA) with administrative responsibility for a child support order administratively terminates the current child support obligation and the medical support provisions when a required or optional administrative termination reason exists.
- Rule 5101:12-60-50.1 describes the process for completing an Administrative termination investigation, issuing findings and recommendations, and the process to impound support.
- Rule 5101:12-60-50.2 describes the process for conducting an Administrative termination hearing, the availability of a court hearing when an Administrative termination request is denied or the parties object to the outcome, the issuance of an Administrative termination order, and the disbursement of impounded funds once an order has been terminated.

The following Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule is being proposed for adoption:

- Rule 5101:12-60-99 is a new rule that contains a compilation of forms, along with their effective or revised effective dates, that are referenced within various rules contained within division 5101:12 of the Administrative Code, but first cited within Chapter 5101:12-60 of the Administrative Code.

A public hearing on the proposed rules will be held at the date, time, and location listed at the top of this notice. Either written or oral testimony will be taken at the public hearing.
