Pursuant to sections 3125.25 and 3111.35 and Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, the director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services gives notice of the department's intent to consider the amendment of the rules as identified below and of a public hearing thereon.

The following Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules are being proposed for amendment as a result of a review conducted in accordance with section 106.03 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) which requires five-year reviews of all state agency rules, and to comply with Senate Bill 70 of the 132<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly.

- Rule 5101:12-40-05, "Determination of the Existence or Non-Existence of a Father and Child Relationship," describes the requirements for a child support enforcement agency (CSEA) to determine the existence or non-existence of a father and child relationship. Revisions to the rule include changing the objection period of the administrative order from 30 to 14 days, and adding language in paragraph (D) to require a IV-D application or referral to be completed.
- Rule 5101:12-40-20, "Administrative Determination of the Existence or Non-Existence of a Father
  and Child Relationship," describes the process a CSEA shall follow to administratively determine the
  existence or non-existence of a father and child relationship. Revisions to this rule include adding
  language in paragraph (A) to require a IV-D application or referral to be completed, and a minor
  grammatical change.
- Rule 5101:12-40-20.3, "Administrative Paternity Orders," describes the requirements for a CSEA to issue an administrative paternity order. Revisions to this rule include correcting a form title in paragraph (A), adding language in paragraph (A) to refer a case to court if identical siblings are named as the alleged father, and changing the objection period of the administrative order from 30 to 14 days.
- Rule 5101:12-40-99, "Chapter 5101:12-40 Forms- Paternity Establishment" contains a compilation
  of forms with their effective or revised effective date, referenced within various rules contained
  within division 5101:12 of the Administrative Code, but first cited within Chapter 5101:12-40 of the
  Administrative Code. Revisions to this rule include revising the JFS 07771, JFS 07774, and JFS
  07782 effective dates, and correcting the JFS 07771 form title.
