



Rule	Summary of major proposed changes
5122-14-02	This rule specifies the accreditation requirements for OhioMHAS-licensed inpatient psychiatric providers. OhioMHAS is proposing to update these requirements to include the new name of the organization formerly known as HFAP (Accreditation Commission for Health Care Inc. (ACHC)) and the correct name of DNV (DNV Healthcare USA Inc.), as well as to conform the rule to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-03	This rule specifies the OhioMHAS licensure procedure for hospitals that receive individuals with mental illness. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to: --Reflect that on and after September 30, 2024, Ohio-MHAS licensed beds do not also need to be registered with the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) due to the exemption from ODH registration in R.C. 3722.02(C)(4) that was passed by the General Assembly through H.B. 110 of the 134 <sup>th</sup> General Assembly; --Specify that OhioMHAS is to have access to, and have copies of, any of a provider's records, regardless of format, to verify compliance with R.C. 5119.33 and rules in this chapter; --Specify that OhioMHAS may conduct interviews with members of the provider's governing body, staff, and others and, with patient consent, the patient; and --Conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-04	This rule specifies the classifications of OhioMHAS-issued licenses for hospitals that receive individuals with mental illness. OhioMHAS is proposing to correct the reference from HFAP to ACHC and update the rule to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-05	This rule specifies the circumstances under which OhioMHAS may revoke or refuse to grant or renew a full, probationary, or interim license. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-06	This rule specifies the procedure an inpatient psychiatric service provider follows to request a waiver or variance from OhioMHAS licensure requirements. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-07	This rule specifies that license holders are to display their current license in a conspicuous place and that the license remains the property of OhioMHAS. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.

5122-14-08	This rule specifies the fees for inpatient psychiatric service provider licensure. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-10	<p>This rule specifies the patient safety and physical plant requirements for psychiatric service provider licensure. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>--Reflect changes in an office name at the Ohio Department of Commerce;</li> <li>--Eliminate text regarding transitional holds recognizing that the definition of “transitional hold” in O.A.C. 5122-14-01 is being amended to make it consistent with the definition of this term in O.A.C. 5122-26-16 (which was recently updated in 2023);</li> <li>--Specify order requirements for restraint when used to safely transport an individual; and</li> <li>--Conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.</li> </ul>
5122-14-11	This rule specifies the rights a patient has while admitted to an OhioMHAS-licensed hospital. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to replace references to “client” with “patient” and conform the rule to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.
5122-14-12	<p>This rule specifies requirements for plans of service and clinical and professional services in OhioMHAS-licensed hospitals, as well as criteria for admissions to and discharges from such hospitals. OhioMHAS is proposing to update the rule to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>--Reflect that on and after September 30, 2024, Ohio-MHAS licensed beds do not also need to be registered with the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) due to the exemption from ODH registration in R.C. 3722.02(C)(4) that was passed by the General Assembly through H.B. 110 of the 134<sup>th</sup> General Assembly;</li> <li>--Specify that psychiatric nursing experience does not, for a nurse hired on or after July 1, 2024, include experience derived from working in a hospital medical unit, emergency department, or other healthcare setting where individuals do not have a primary psychiatric diagnosis.</li> <li>--Conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.</li> </ul>
5122-14-13	This rule specifies all of the following: how an inpatient psychiatric service provider is to maintain patient records; complete an assessment of, and have a written individualized treatment plan for, each patient; and develop a discharge plan for each patient. OhioMHAS is proposing to update it to conform to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.

Rule	Summary of major proposed changes
5122-14-14	This rule establishes standards to ensure the prompt and accurate notification of certain prescribed incidents. OhioMHAS is proposing to update the rule to refer to electronic reporting through the Web Enabled Incident Reporting System (WEIRS) and conform the rule to <i>LSC Rule Drafting Manual</i> drafting standards.

The hearing will be conducted in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Ohio Revised Code. Any person affected by the rules may appear and be heard in person, by his or her attorney, or both; may present his or her position, arguments, or contentions, orally or in writing; offer and examine witnesses; and present evidence tending to show that the rules, if adopted or effectuated, will be unreasonable or unlawful.
