Public Notice and Public Hearing Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Five-Year Rule Review and Draft Revisions to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapters 3745-18, "Sulfur Dioxide Regulations Rules"

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) has performed a review of the above referenced rules primarily to satisfy the requirements of Section 106.03 and 106.031 of the Ohio Revised Code (five-year review). The DAPC finds these rules to be necessary and with need for changes. The rules in this chapter set limits, testing and recordkeeping requirements for emissions of sulfur dioxide from sources in the state of Ohio. A complete discussion of changes can be found in the synopsis document on Ohio EPAs website at the URL listed below.

Also included with this rulemaking for review and comment are draft State Implementation Plan (SIP) submittals for the removal from OAC rule 3745-18-37 of emission limits for Boiler #4 at DTE. St. Bernard, LLC. In Cincinnati, Ohio and modification of emission limits and stack height at the Veolia Fort Hill Plant in Miami, Ohio. The draft submittals are intended to show that these removals and modifications do not cause a violation of Section 110(I) of the Clean Air Act.

Pursuant to Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, DAPC was required to consult with interested parties affected by the rules before the Division formally adopts them. On April 13, 2021 these rules went out for a 30-day review by interested parties. Ohio EPA's responses to comments received is available electronically on Ohio EPA's website at the URL listed below.

Pursuant to Part D of Title I of the Clean Air Act (CAA), Ohio EPA is required to establish a SIP for the attainment and maintenance of the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS). The abovementioned rules are a part of Ohio's SIP and the proposed amendments, and 110(I) demonstrations will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) as a modification of the SIP.

Ohio EPA will hold an in-person and virtual public hearing on the rules on **Thursday, December 16, 2021 at 11:00 AM**. The in-person hearing will be at the same time and date and will be located at Ohio EPA, Suite 700, 50 W. Town Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. During the hearing, the public may submit written comments on the record about the proposed rules. If participating virtually, comments may be submitted electronically and may be submitted verbally if participating in person.

Written statements submitted after December 16, 2021 may be considered as time and circumstances permit but will not be part of the official record of the hearing.

Ohio EPA held a 30-day comment period ending on December 16, 2021, and a public hearing on December 16, 2021, regarding proposed amendments to rules in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-18, "Sulfur Dioxide Regulations." This document summarizes the comments and questions received during the comment period and public hearing.

Ohio EPA reviewed and considered all comments received during the public comment period and hearing. By law, Ohio EPA has authority to consider specific issues related to protection of the environment and public health.

In an effort to help you review this document, the questions are grouped by topic and organized in a consistent format. The name of the commenter follows the comment in parentheses.

General/Overall Concerns

Comment 1: In 3745-18-03(B)(6), "ArcelorMittal Cleveland LLC" is requested to be revised to "Cleveland-Cliffs Cleveland Works LLC." In 3745-18-24(O), "ArcelorMittal Cleveland LLC" is requested to be revised to "Cleveland-Cliffs Cleveland Works LLC" in two locations.

In 3745-18-03(C)(3)(c), "AK Steel - Zanesville" is requested to be revised to "Cleveland-Cliffs Steel Corporation Zanesville Works."

In 3745-18-84(J), "ArcelorMittal Warren" is requested to be revised to "Cleveland-Cliffs Warren." (Rich Zavoda, Manager, Air Quality Program, Cleveland-Cliffs, Inc.)

Response 1: Thank you for your comments. The commenter is requesting updates to facility names in various rules in this chapter. Updating facility information to reflect current facility information including names and addresses in facility specific rules was a specific focus of the 5-year review conducted in this rulemaking. Facility information changes in these rules reflect facility information as it appeared in the STARS2 electronic permitting system in the spring of 2021. It is likely that your facility's name changes

occurred after DAPC performed our audit of the system which was used to amend the rules.

Removing the rules from the JCARR process at this time to make changes would delay the rulemaking process for these rules. DAPC is, however, planning to reopen the rulemaking process for rules in this chapter in Spring of 2022 to make additional changes and will make these changes at that time.
