Public Notice Public Hearing Scheduled For Proposed Rulemaking Governing Water Quality Standards

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Section 6111.041 of the Ohio Revised Code and in accordance with Chapter 119, proposes to original file the following Water Quality Standards Program rules of the Ohio Administrative Code:

Rule #	Rule Title
3745-1-09	Scioto river drainage basin.
3745-1-16	Southeast Ohio river tributaries drainage basin.
3745-1-17	Southwest Ohio river tributaries drainage basin.
3745-1-21	Great Miami river drainage basin.

OAC Chapter 3745-1 contains Ohio's standards for water quality. This rulemaking includes the review and update of four beneficial use designation rules in the chapter to reflect the latest scientific information.

The Agency invites all interested parties to comment on these rules. The public comment period will run until December 17, 2021. A public hearing on this proposed rulemaking will be held to consider public comments in accordance with Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Ohio EPA will be holding an in-person and virtual public hearing on the rules on December 17, 2021 at 1:00pm. The in-person hearing will be at the same time and date and will be located at Ohio EPA, Suite 700, 50 W. Town Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. During the hearing, the public may submit written comments on the record about the proposed rules if participating virtually and verbally if participating in person. Written comments may be submitted during the virtual public hearing. All comments received at the virtual hearing or via email by close of business on December 17, 2021 will be considered by Ohio EPA prior to final action on this rulemaking proposal. Ohio EPA held a public comment period from November 2, 2021 to December 17, 2021 with a public hearing held on December 17, 2021 regarding Beneficial Use Designations Wave 2. This document summarizes the comments and questions received during the public hearing and the associated comment period.

Ohio EPA reviewed and considered all comments received during the public comment period. By law, Ohio EPA has authority to consider specific issues related to protection of the environment and public health.

In an effort to help you review this document, the questions are grouped by topic and organized in a consistent format. The name of the commenter follows the comment in parentheses.

General/Overall Concerns

Comment 1:

Concerning the BUDs for the Scioto River Drainage Basin, OAC 3745-1-09, in our comments of July 7, 2021 (Comment #2 in the November 2021 Ohio EPA Response to Comments), MBI noted and agreed with revisions under consideration at that time, and now proposed for adoption. We appreciate the work and data that was necessary to confirm these designations and especially those that resulted in higher use designations. We appreciate the acceptance of our recommendations based on the MBI 2015 Scioto River and Lower Olentangy River mainstem Level 3 biological and habitat assessment. We also acknowledge and agree with Ohio EPA tributary upgrades, including Bull Run, Camp Run, George's Run, Long Run, Lick Run, etc.) (MBI)

Response 1:

Ohio EPA appreciates the ongoing input and collaborative work with MBI. The Agency has not made any revisions based on these comments.

Comment 2:

Concerning the BUDs for the Southeast Ohio River tributaries drainage basin, OAC 3745-1-16, while we appreciate the Agency response to our comment about the use designation of Little Kyger Creek, we remain committed to our previous statements about Warmwater Habitat (WWH) being the more appropriate designation. Please see MBI's full comments submitted in response to the November 16, 2021, proposed rules posting, where we have offered additional information and context for this position in the detailed comment. We cannot emphasize enough the need for the agency to be consistent with established practice and precedent, such as the improvements and beneficial use designation upgrades on Monday and Sunday Creeks. (MBI)

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Response 2:

The Agency continues to believe that the MWH – Mine Affected (MWH-MA) designation is suitable for Little Kyger Creek based on the extensive sedimentation and sand bedload present from legacy mining as documented in the 2015 survey (Biological and Water Quality Study of Selected Southeastern Ohio River Tributaries, 2015). Page 64 of Ohio's report explains the rationale for MWH-MA rather than WWH.

The Agency also emphasizes that water bodies assigned a modified warmwater habitat or limited resource water use are subject to periodic review. If conditions improve beyond expectations, the designations currently proposed for these water bodies will be reassigned in the future. Monday and Sunday Creeks went through a similar process, with changes to use designations happening in 2007 (LRW to WWH) as new data supported these changes.

Comment 3:

Concerning the BUDs for the Great Miami River Drainage Basin, OAC 3745-1-21, MBI appreciates the upgrade from WWH to EWH (Exceptional Warmwater Habitat) for the Great Miami River-Steele Dam (RM 82.0) to the Dayton WWTP outfall (RM 76.2) and the data collection and pollution control efforts that went into this improvement. For the Whitewater River watershed, we appreciate where streams that MBI surveyed, submitted data and a report were included as part of the proposed rules. MBI appreciates the upgrades from WWH to EWH for Dry Fork, Howard Creek, and Kiata Creek. (MBI)

Response 3:

Ohio EPA appreciates the ongoing input and collaborative work with MBI. The Agency has not made any revisions based on these comments.

Comment 4:

As the agency is already well aware, MBI is concerned about the status of a Primary Headwater Habitat (PHW) use designation. We have offered a proposed solution to this impasse by integrating these types of streams into the WWH suite of uses. Until this is resolved in a meaningful way we will continue to make comments especially where MBI has conducted such assessments as part of Level 3 bioassessments. We appreciate the concurrence in the November 2021 Response to Comments of the need for PHW data to be documented. We understand the difficulties that the agency has had in managing headwater streams from a policy perspective, but we see no harm in maintaining a publicly available database. (MBI)

Response 4:

We refer back to Ohio EPA's November 2021 Response to Comments Response 4, highlighting that the Agency recognizes the usefulness of a publicly available database, but it does not have the capacity to develop one at this time: "Resolving this issue [PHW use designation] remains a challenge to be solved, but that goes beyond the scope and goal of this particular rulemaking. Regarding the recommendation that these [PHW] data be documented in a publicly available database, we agree. Again, this remains a challenge because EA3 is the main repository of biological and habitat data used by the Agency and it does not currently have the capacity to accept only PHW macroinvertebrate data. Although discussions about expanding EA3 to accept PHW have periodically occurred, other competing priorities have hampered efforts to develop that capacity."
