Public Pre-Notice Proposed Rulemaking Governing Water Quality Standards and Implementation of Water Quality Standards Programs

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Sections 6111.041 of the Ohio Revised Code and in accordance with Chapter 119, proposes to amend the following rule of the Ohio Administrative Code:

3745-1-07 Beneficial use designations and biological criteria.

And to add as a new rule:

3745-2-03 Application of biological survey data to development of water quality-based effluent limitations.

These rules address water quality standards and the implementation of those standards.

The purpose of this rule making is to primarily to update the biocriteria narrative portion of the rules to remove a U.S. EPA objection to the current rule and incorporate a Memorandum of Understanding between Ohio EPA and U.S. EPA that was signed in 2000. This rulemaking will also eliminate the Limited Warmwater Habitat use designation, which is obsolete.

The public comment period will run until October 16, 2023. A public hearing on this proposed rulemaking will be held to consider public comments in accordance with Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. Ohio EPA will be holding an in-person and virtual public hearing on the rules on October 16, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. The in-person hearing will be at the same time and date and will be located at Ohio EPA, Suite 700, 50 W. Town Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. During the hearing, the public may submit written comments on the record about the proposed rules if participating virtually and verbally if participating in person.

Ohio EPA held a comment period beginning on August 28, 2023, and a public hearing on October 16, 2023, regarding proposed Water Quality Standards rule amendments. This document summarizes the comments and questions received during the public comment period, which ended on October 16, 2023. No comments were received at the public hearing.

Ohio EPA reviewed and considered all comments received during the public comment period. By law, Ohio EPA has authority to consider specific issues related to protection of the environment and public health.

In an effort to help you review this document, the questions are grouped by topic and organized in a consistent format. The name of the commenter follows the comment in parentheses.

General Comments

Comment 1:

Biological criteria "provide a direct measure of attainment of the warmwater habitat, exceptional warmwater habitat, and modified warmwater habitat aquatic life uses." OAC 3745-1-07(C). Accordingly, these criteria play a significant role in assessing water quality and in ensuring that regulatory controls are imposed only when appropriate. AOMWA is concerned that the new rulemaking inappropriately fails to carry forward these well-established principles associated with biological criteria.

First, the rules should maintain existing protections for point sources that are not the primary cause of nonattainment under certain conditions. Under the current regulatory framework, when a point source meets all applicable chemical specific and whole effluent chemical criteria, additional regulatory controls shall not be imposed, unless certain conditions are present, including that "[t]he point sources are shown to be the primary contributing cause of the nonattainment." OAC § 3745-1-07(C)(2)(a). That is, if a point source is not a primary cause of nonattainment for the applicable biological criteria, and the associated chemical specific aquatic life criteria and whole effluent criteria are being

met, then additional regulatory controls cannot be imposed. This aspect of the rules appropriately requires a relationship between a facility's discharge and the receiving water body's nonattainment. Conversely, it protects point sources from the imposition of costly requirements that may provide little or no environmental benefit. This feature of the existing rules reflects good public policy by placing the regulatory focus on the primary cause of the nonattainment, while avoiding imposing costly obligations on the Publicly Owned Treatment Works and other point sources when they are not the primary source of the problem.

By contrast, the Proposed Rules would allow regulatory controls merely when "point sources are shown to be a primary cause of the non-attainment." AOWMA is concerned with this language because one could argue that there are many "primary causes" of nonattainment in a watershed, and we are concerned that the amendment targets minor sources. AOMWA grew more concerned when we suggested that the Agency define "primary cause," and the Agency refused to do so. AOMWA requested that Ohio EPA define "primary cause" to mean a source that contributes greater than 40% of the total pollutant load.2 This revision would ensure that insignificant sources are not required to install costly regulatory controls. However, Ohio EPA declined to accept this clarification. It appears that Ohio EPA is retaining discretion to require costly regulatory controls even from sources that contribute a small portion of the load.

When we conferred with the Agency regarding this issue, the Agency indicated that they intend to require regulatory controls when doing so would "move the needle" on attainment, and the Proposed Rules would reflect current practice. However, AOMWA believes that the current rules strike the appropriate balance and the proposed revisions upset this balance. If Ohio EPA were not interested in targeting insignificant sources, then the Agency could have either (1) left this rule language alone or (2) revised these rules to provide additional assurance to the regulated community by defining "primary cause." We submit that Ohio law should retain some reasonable parameters in these circumstances. [Frank Greenland, Association of Ohio Metropolitan Wastewater Agencies (AOMWA)]

Comment 2:

Second, when chemical aquatic life criteria and whole effluent criteria are being met, Ohio EPA's amendments appear to be designed to impose regulatory controls on minor contributors in another manner. The same sentence in the Proposed Rules states: "The point sources are shown to be a primary cause of the non-attainment of the biological criteria, based on an assessment of annual or seasonal pollutant dynamics in the receiving water(s)." Similar to the comment above, AOMWA has concerns

with the apparent goal of targeting point sources by modifying the framework so that even minor sources are considered "a primary cause" of non-attainment, even if they are a marginally significant cause of the issue for a single season.

Response 1 and 2:

Ohio EPA discussed these comments with AOMWA and clarified the intent behind the proposed rule language, revisions to which were made to address stakeholders' comments in the draft Interested Party Review version of the rule.

The Agency reiterates its position that the proposed rule language maintains the existing protections for point sources provided by the current rule and does not interfere with the Agency's ability to address point-source-caused problems in permit or TMDLs. The rule as proposed allows for 'a primary cause' to be determined by a waterbody-specific model. No scientifically meaningful definition of 'a primary cause' can be set outside of a model. Any such models and allocations are available for stakeholder review and comment as part of the NPDES permit or TMDL development process.

End of Response to Comments
