The Common Sense Initiative is established in R.C. 107.61 to eliminate excessive and duplicative rules and regulations that stand in the way of job creation. Under the Common Sense Initiative, agencies must balance the critical objectives of regulations that have an adverse impact on business with the costs of compliance by the regulated parties. Agencies should promote transparency, responsiveness, predictability, and flexibility while developing regulations that are fair and easy to follow. Costs to initial licensure include the cost of a college education, Cost of taking an examination, cost of the BCI/FBI background check (\$47.25), Cost of obtaining continuing education. Licensure costs \$100, renewal \$70.
