The Common Sense Initiative is established in R.C. 107.61 to eliminate excessive and duplicative rules and regulations that stand in the way of job creation. Under the Common Sense Initiative, agencies must balance the critical objectives of regulations that have an adverse impact on business with the costs of compliance by the regulated parties. Agencies should promote transparency, responsiveness, predictability, and flexibility while developing regulations that are fair and easy to follow. Agencies should prioritize compliance over punishment, and to that end, should utilize. plain language in the development of regulations.

Regulatory Intent

2. Please briefly describe the draft regulation in plain language. Please include the key provisions of the regulation as well as any proposed amendments.

This rule package includes 201 hazardous waste management rules regarding requirements and permitting (Chapter 3745-50); identification and listing of hazardous waste (Chapter 3745-51); generator standards (Chapter 3745-52); transporter standards (Chapter 3745-53); treatment, storage, and disposal standards (Chapters 3745-54, 3745-55, 3745-57, 3745-65, 3745-66, 3745-205, and 3745-256); management of specific types of hazardous waste (Chapter 3745-266); standards for owners and operators of hazardous waste management facilities operating under a standardized permit (Chapter 3745-267); land disposal restrictions (Chapter 3745-270); and universal waste management (Chapter 3745-273).

Draft regulations in this package cover three new-to-Ohio hazardous waste permitting concepts: Standardized Permitting; Hazardous Waste Management Requirements For Remedial Action Plan Permits (RAP); and Research, Development, and Demonstration (RD&D) Permits. All these federal rules are optional for state adoption and provide for an alternative approach to the traditional (current) process of obtaining a hazardous waste permit. This rule package also addresses a Technical Corrections Federal Register (FR) which covers amendments to rules from the federal Generator Improvements rule, the Export-Import rule, the Hazardous Waste Pharmaceutical rule, and the Definition of Solid Waste rule, all of which Ohio addressed in a prior rulemaking.

3. Please list the Ohio statute(s) that authorize the agency, board or commission to adopt the rule(s) and the statute(s) that amplify that authority.

Statutory Authority: Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3734.02, 3734.05, 3734.12 Rules Amplify: ORC 3734.02, 3734.05, 3734.12, 3734.13, 3745.01

4. Does the regulation implement a federal requirement? Is the proposed regulation being adopted or amended to enable the state to obtain or maintain approval to administer and enforce a federal law or to participate in a federal program? *If yes, please briefly explain the source and substance of the federal requirement.*

Yes, the regulations in this package implement federal requirements. However, the regulations are optional as they are an alternative approach to the traditional hazardous waste permit process. The proposed regulations are being adopted and amended to enable the state to continue its hazardous waste program. Ohio's hazardous waste program is required to be functionally equivalent to its federal counterparts to maintain authorization to administer the program.

5. If the regulation implements a federal requirement, but includes provisions not specifically required by the federal government, please explain the rationale for exceeding the federal requirement.

None of the proposed changes to currently effective rules or proposed new rules exceed the federal requirements. All the rules in this package have been determined to be equivalent to their federal counterpart provisions, consistent with their Ohio statutory intent, or consistent with federally based universal waste management requirements.

6. What is the public purpose for this regulation (i.e., why does the Agency feel that there needs to be any regulation in this area at all)?

In order for Ohio EPA to maintain authorization to regulated hazardous waste in Ohio, Ohio EPA must adopt new rules that are equivalent to the federal requirements. The proposed amended rules are part of the authorized program and must remain equivalent and effective to maintain Ohio's authorization.

These regulations are being proposed to provide facilities alternative methods for obtaining a hazardous waste permit. The Federal Registers that will be addressed by this rulemaking are outlined above.

7. How will the Agency measure the success of this regulation in terms of outputs and/or outcomes?

Ohio EPA will measure the success of these regulations through the degree of compliance with these regulations by the regulated community, the minimal occurrences of hazards to public health, safety, and the environment, and the continuation of Ohio EPA's federal authorization to regulate hazardous waste in Ohio.

8. Are any of the proposed rules contained in this rule package being submitted pursuant to R.C. 101.352, 101.353, 106.032, 121.93, or 121.931? *If yes, please specify the rule number(s), the specific R.C. section requiring this submission, and a detailed explanation.*

No rules are being submitted pursuant to R.C. 101.352, 101.353, 106.032, 121.93, and 121.931.

Development of the Regulation

9. Please list the stakeholders included by the Agency in the development or initial review of the draft regulation.

If applicable, please include the date and medium by which the stakeholders were initially contacted.

The rules included in this package were sent for a 30-day Early Stakeholder Outreach on October 4, 2023.

10. What input was provided by the stakeholders, and how did that input affect the draft regulation being proposed by the Agency?

Ohio EPA received one comment during the ESO comment period. This comment regarding contingency plans in OAC rule 3745-51-420. Currently, OAC 3745-51-420 is equivalent to its federal counterpart rule 40 CFR 261.420. Ohio EPA is required to maintain equivalency to continue federal authorization of the hazardous waste program, therefore this comment did not result in any changes to the Interested Parties draft rule.

11. What scientific data was used to develop the rule or the measurable outcomes of the rule? How does this data support the regulation being proposed?

No scientific data was used to develop the rule or the measurable outcomes of the rule. The Ohio hazardous waste rules are required by state and federal law to be equivalent to their federal counterpart rules.

12. What alternative regulations (or specific provisions within the regulation) did the Agency consider, and why did it determine that these alternatives were not appropriate? If none, why didn't the Agency consider regulatory alternatives? Alternative regulations may include performance-based regulations, which define the required outcome, but do not dictate the process the regulated stakeholders must use to comply.

Alternate provisions would not be appropriate for these rules. The Ohio hazardous waste rules are required by state and federal law to be equivalent to their federal counterpart rules.

13. What measures did the Agency take to ensure that this regulation does not duplicate an existing Ohio regulation?

When the amended rules included in this package were originally promulgated, Ohio EPA worked with LSC and the regulated community to ensure that these rules did not duplicate any other Ohio rules. These rules and/or other Ohio EPA rules have been amended in the past to eliminate duplicative requirements. Ohio EPA has worked to ensure that that all new rules in this package do not duplicate any existing requirements from both Ohio EPA and other agencies. Ohio EPA is the only agency that has jurisdiction to adopt regulations governing the management of hazardous waste.

14. Please describe the Agency's plan for implementation of the regulation, including any measures to ensure that the regulation is applied consistently and predictably for the regulated community.

Ohio EPA's implementation of these rules will include notifying the regulated community of both the amendments to existing rules and the addition of new rules. Ohio EPA will work to provide guidance to the regulated community as needed. Additionally, Ohio EPA will brief field inspectors and staff on the proposed changes, so that they will be well equipped to offer assistance as they interact with the regulated community.

Adverse Impact to Business

- **15.** Provide a summary of the estimated cost of compliance with the rule(s). Specifically, please do the following:
 - a. Identify the scope of the impacted business community, and

The business community impacted by Ohio's hazardous waste rules consists of the businesses that generate, treat, dispose of, or transport hazardous waste.

b. Quantify and identify the nature of all adverse impact (e.g., fees, fines, employer time for compliance, etc.).

The adverse impact can be quantified in terms of dollars, hours to comply, or other factors; and may be estimated for the entire regulated population or for a representative business. Please include the source for your information/estimated impact.

There are no adverse impacts being added to the amended rules or promulgated by the new rules in this package. The costs in Ohio that may be above the costs in the corresponding federal regulations are discussed in question 5 above.

Amended rules in this package include those that are included to fulfill their five-year review requirement, as well as those that have been updated to match their federal counterpart rule. The proposed amendments do not impact the stringency nor the cost of compliance for these rules. The proposed new rules are functionally equivalent to their federal counterparts. The standardized permitting rules are optional and provide an alternative to the traditional hazardous waste permits.

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Regarding the rules as they exist, as a program, for five-year review purposes:

Ohio EPA's hazardous waste management rules are required, by federal statute and rule, as well as Ohio statute, to be functionally equivalent to the final federal rules (i.e., there may be text differences from the federal rules, but the resulting requirements must be the same.) Each Ohio rule has a federal counterpart rule (there are a few exceptions to this). If the state hazardous waste rules did not exist, the federal hazardous waste rules would still apply to Ohio businesses, so any costs incurred as a result of compliance with the Ohio rule would also be incurred as a result of compliance with the federal counterpart rules. With the exception of a few Ohio statute-based fee rules, the cost of compliance for state and federal requirements would be similar.

The adverse impact of the hazardous waste management rules (state or federal) varies widely depending on the nature of the management activity being conducted by the regulated community. This can include costs of obtaining a treatment, storage, and disposal permit (which can cost over \$100,000), personnel training, safety equipment, conducting inspections and keeping records, submitting reports to Ohio EPA (electronically in many cases, which incurs a nominal cost), etc.

In promulgating the Ohio hazardous waste rules, Ohio EPA only makes changes necessary to "Ohio-ize" the finalized federal language so that the rules 1) maintain the required equivalence with the federal program, 2) do not create problems (or costs) for the citizens and industries of Ohio that were addressed and resolved during the federal comment-response process and in the federal rule promulgation process, and 3) do not create new problems (or costs) for the citizens and industries of Ohio the citizens and industries of Ohio that were not addressed in that federal comment-response and federal rule promulgation process. Equivalence and state rule stringency is reviewed by U.S. EPA Region 5 via the authorization process that is also a federal requirement (see 40 CFR Part 271).

16. Are there any proposed changes to the rules that will <u>reduce</u> a regulatory burden imposed on the business community? Please identify. (*Reductions in regulatory burden* may include streamlining reporting processes, simplifying rules to improve readability, eliminating requirements, reducing compliance time or fees, or other related factors).

The amended and new rules in this package are designed to offer an optional, alternative approach to the traditional or current process of obtaining a hazardous waste permit. The planned changes will offer a streamlined approach to obtaining a hazardous waste permit. Use of these options might reduce the regulatory burden, if the regulated entity chose to use them. The amendments will also address previous errors in rules promulgated under the federal Export-Import Rule and the Generator Improvements Rule.

17. Why did the Agency determine that the regulatory intent justifies the adverse impact to the regulated business community?

Ohio EPA must promulgate rules that are equivalent to their federal RCRA counterpart rules in order to maintain its authorization to regulate hazardous waste in Ohio. Without adoption of these rules, Ohio could lose its ability to regulate hazardous waste in Ohio and the impacted community would be subject to the same rules by U.S. EPA.

Regulatory Flexibility

18. Does the regulation provide any exemptions or alternative means of compliance for small businesses? Please explain.

The standardized permitting rules provide for an alternative method for obtaining a hazardous waste management permit, as opposed to the traditional permit process.

19. How will the agency apply Ohio Revised Code section 119.14 (waiver of fines and penalties for paperwork violations and first-time offenders) into implementation of the regulation?

The director will evaluate the applicability of ORC 119.14 to entities regulated by these rules when assessing fines and penalties for paperwork violations and first-time offenders.

20. What resources are available to assist small businesses with compliance of the regulation?

Ohio EPA offers the following resources:
