The Common Sense Initiative is established in R.C. 107.61 to eliminate excessive and duplicative rules and regulations that stand in the way of job creation. Under the Common Sense Initiative, agencies must balance the critical objectives of regulations that have an adverse impact on business with the costs of compliance by the regulated parties. Agencies should promote transparency, responsiveness, predictability, and flexibility while developing regulations that are fair and easy to follow. Agencies should prioritize compliance over punishment, and to that end, should utilize plain language in the development of regulations.

- 3770-2-02 Sets forth the grounds the Lottery will consider when deciding whether to deny an application for a Lottery Sales Agent License.
- 3770-4-02 Sets forth and establishes mandates and conditions for issuance of a new license, transfer of an existing license to a new location, the temporary issuance of a license, and renewal of an existing license, as well as the issuance of Lottery products and equipment.
- 3770-4-06 Sets forth the Lottery Sales Agents' responsibilities regarding the return of tickets to settle Lottery accounts. It also explains the methods for collection of Lottery Sales Revenues.

 - 3770-2-02 The rule states the grounds the director may consider when deciding whether to grant an individual or cooperate applicant's request for a Lottery Sales Agent License.
 - 3770-4-02 The rule sets forth the requirements associated with the issuance of lottery licenses, products and equipment.
 - 3770-4-06 To establish uniform procedures for the return and settlement of lottery tickets and the collection of Lottery Sales Revenue.

 - 3770-2-01 The Lottery maintains review procedures for the review of Lottery Sales Agent License applications which ensure consistent and standardized requirements are being maintained.
 - 3770-2-02 Success will be measured through consistent enforcement of these standardized requirements, which will ensure ongoing compliance with lottery rules and regulations, while maintaining the integrity of all lottery sales agent license holders.
 - 3770-4-02 Success will be measured through consistent enforcement of these standardized requirements, which will ensure ongoing compliance with lottery rules and regulations, while maintaining the integrity of all lottery sales agent license holders.
 - 3770-4-06 The Lottery utilizes software to track the revenue for each Lottery Sales Agent account to determine if any problems exist.

We believe the nature of the proposed rules are appropriate. We have not received any complaints regarding the operation of the regulation in the past. We also did not receive any comments during the stakeholder comment period with regard to these regulations.

The Lottery's plans to continue its current operating procedures with regard to implementation of these regulations.

Adverse Impact to Business

3770-2-01 – This rule establishes the requirements that a Lottery Sales Agent have to meet in order to be eligible.

3770-2-02 – Applicants may have their request for a license denied for the reasons stated in the rule, including any fraudulent misrepresentation on the application or during the licensing process, lack of experience, character or general fitness for licensure, failing to comply with the Lottery Act or Americans with Disabilities Act, expected sales volume deficiencies, and/or lack of financial responsibility or security.

3770-4-02 - Failure to pay the application fee, deposit, or obtain and maintain a bond, would be grounds to deny or revoke a lottery sales agent license. The adverse impact can be quantified in terms of the value in dollars of lost revenue relating to the absence of sales of lottery tickets or other products by a current or potential sales agent due to the denial or revocation of a lottery sales agent license application.

3770-4-06 - If a sales agent fails to timely transfer funds to the lottery, that sales agent may face penalties that include, but are not limited to, a monetary penalty and/or license modification, suspension or revocation.

Any monetary estimates are not possible, because in many cases the revenue is hypothetically changing, and/or may be contingent on many other contributing factors outside of the Lottery control.

16. Are there any proposed changes to the rules that will <u>reduce</u> a regulatory burden imposed on the business community? Please identify. (Reductions in regulatory burden may include streamlining reporting processes, simplifying rules to improve readability, eliminating requirements, reducing compliance time or fees, or other related factors).

No proposed changes will have an impact on or reduce any regulatory burden.

17. Why did the Agency determine that the regulatory intent justifies the adverse impact to the regulated business community?

Lottery Sales Agents are required to follow guidelines and procedures, which have been promulgated by the Lottery. Consistently enforced standards maintain the integrity of the Lottery and directly benefit the business community as a whole.

The adverse impacts of requiring applications be submitted pursuant to licensing processes by a Lottery Sales Agent is justified by the resulting establishment of consistent applicant eligibility criteria, as well as the requiring of the Lottery to give notice of the rules and regulations, and standards that are expected to be adhered to ensure ongoing compliance of uninterrupted licensure.

Regulatory Flexibility

18. Does the regulation provide any exemptions or alternative means of compliance for small businesses? Please explain.

No, many Lottery Sales Agents are small businesses, and are required to meet the same simple standards, regardless of size or profitability.

19. How will the agency apply Ohio Revised Code section 119.14 (waiver of fines and penalties for paperwork violations and first-time offenders) into implementation of the regulation?

There is no automatic penalty for a paperwork violation.
